Foundation course:

Roskilde University offers a 2 week Foundation Course to international students. We strongly recommend international students to participate in the course.

**English level/Language requirements:** 

At Roskilde University we do not require a language test. However Roskilde University expects exchange students who will follow courses in English to have a level of English equivalent to 6,5 on the IELTS-scale or 550 on the TOEFL-scale, in order for them to participate in the project work and follow the courses.

**Danish Evaluation and Grade System:**

**Educational Principles:** Education at Roskilde University is based on

the following principles: Interdisciplinarity and problem-orientation, project work, team

work and close interrelation between

research and education.

**Interdisciplinarity and problem-orientation:** The previous academic division into

disciplines has been replaced by interdisciplinary focus on issues to be analyzed and solved. As in the university's research, students are encouraged to demonstrate how different theoretical approaches may contribute to the understanding of a specific issue.

**Project work:** Students are trained to organize and prepare

major written reports setting out the results they have achieved through their surveys

and analyses.

**Group work:** Group work is the basic study method

troughout the study programmes. Students learn the importance of the coorporation

and responsibility.

**Research and education:** At Roskilde University, researchers are

attached to the individual project groups as

supervisors. The supervisor actively

cooporates with the group in his/her role as consultant, and knowledgeable discussion

participant.
